For me, the intersection where these two notions meet is in storytelling and especially in the oral traditions of folklore. Before there was reading and writing, humanity was telling each other stories; speaking magic and different worlds into existence. When I found out that the theme of the Reading Agency's Summer Reading Challenge was 'Story Garden' I immediately knew that folklore would be at the core of this piece. There is such an incredibly rich culture of myths and legends from our shared history and I wanted to celebrate this in the work. Books like A Treasury of Folklore: Woodland & Forests by Dee Dee Chainey & Willow Winsham, Weird Woods, Tales from the Haunted Forests of Britain by John Miller and, of course, Lord of the Rings by J. R. R. Tolkien provided me with the creative inspiration and the play continued to evolve from there. Anyone who attended the read-through back in April can attest to how much the piece has grown and I would like to thank the cast for meeting me in the middle in this brilliant process of collaboration. ## YAT IN THE LIBRARY

In the autumn of 2024, a creative seed was planted-a collaboration between Richmond upon Thames Library Service and YAT began to take root. Inspired by a shared commitment to sharing stories and fostering creativity, the idea blossomed into a unique production tied to one of the UK's most beloved literary traditions: the Summer Reading Challenge. Each summer, The Reading Agency partners with libraries across the country to encourage children aged 4-11 to keep reading during the summer holidays. By taking on the challenge to read six library books between 5 July and 13 September, young participants are rewarded with stickers, a medal, and a certificate-small tokens for a big achievement. When the 2025 theme was revealed-The Story Garden, a magical space where wild tales grow, fantastical creatures roam, and nature's wonders come to life-the vision for the show became instantly clear. What better way to capture the theme's spirit than through a production that celebrates the boundless power of storytelling? This collaboration is more than just a performance-it's a joyful tribute to the imagination of children and young people, and a reminder of how stories can plant the seeds of wonder that grow for a lifetime.




Ominous, stylish, and brutally suspenseful, this is Christie as you've never seen her—psychological, cinematic, and disturbingly modern.
