Youth Action Theatre

Youth Action Theatre is dedicated to stimulating the love of drama and theatre through drama workshops and production experience in young people aged fifteen to twenty-five. Other than age, there is no restriction on membership. Although it is a completely voluntary group and the work is thoroughly enjoyed, a strict disciplined approach is maintained and dedication is required to achieve the maximum possible professionalism and the highest standard in the final production.

Founded in 1970, YAT's first production in Spring 1971 was The Diary of Anne Frank. Since then, it has presented nearly seventy major productions of a full range of plays including Shakespeare, modern, progressive, musical and also new plays by members.

Since 1981, YAT has taken a production abroad approximately once every two years, this being the 10th overseas visit. The first was Godspell which was taken to Hamburg; Berlin has been visited three times along with trips to Vienna, Leipzig and Kiev (when still part of the Soviet Union). The last two occasions were to the USA to perform at the Harry Hope Theatre in the Eastern Connecticut State University; In 1995 Cider with Rosie and in 1996 Juno and the Paycock.

The warm welcome YAT received on these occasions has encouraged the company to return with Adam Bede which will be presented subsequently on it's return to the UK.

Affiliated to the Teddington Theatre Club, YAT has presented many of it's productions at TTC's Hampton Court Theatre, which is in the process of being replaced by a completely new theatre; The Hampton Hill Playhouse the shell of which is currently is currently in the process of being fitted out. The cost of this is being borne by a National Lottery award from the Art's Council of Great Britain. YAT is hoping to stage it's first production in this theatre in the Autumn of 1999.

The Author

MARY ANN EVANS WAS BORN IN THE COUNTY OF WARWICKSHIRE, ENGLAND IN 1819. IN HER THIRTYS, SHE MOVED TO LONDON WERE SHE MET A DISTINGUISHED 'MAN OF LETTERS' GEORGE HENRY LEWES, WHO WAS SEPARATED FROM HIS WIFE BUT NO POSSIBILITY OF DIVORCE. THEY DECIDED TO LIVE TOGETHER, AND DID SO UNTIL HIS DEATH. IT WAS HE WHO ENCOURAGED HER TO TURN FROM PHILOSOPHY TO FICTION AND DURING THOSE YEARS SHE WROTE HER MOST FAMOUS NOVELS WHICH AS WELL AS ADAM BEDE INCLUDE THE MILL ON THE FLOSS, SILAS MARNER AND MIDDLEMARCH. BECAUSE OF HER LIFESTYLE, SHE WROTE UNDER HER PEN-NAME GEORGE ELIOT.

Time & Place

THE NOVEL IS SET IN THE DYING YEARS OF THE 18TH CENTURY BEFORE THE MAIN EFFECTS OF THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION HAD TAKEN EFFECT IN RURAL COMMUNITIES.

MOST OF THE ACTION AND CHARACTERS LIVED IN THE FICTIONAL VILLAGE OF HAYSLOPE IN A COUNTY CALLED LOAMSHIRE WHICH IS DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: 'THE GREEN LAY AT THE EXTREMITY OF THE VILLAGE AND FROM IT THE ROAD BRANCHED OFF IN TWO DIRECTIONS, ONE LEADING FURTHER UP THE HILL BY THE CHURCH AND THE OTHER WINDING GENTLY DOWN TOWARDS THE VALLEY. ON THE SIDE OF THE GREEN THAT LED TOWARDS THE CHURCH, THE BROKEN LINE OF THATCHED COTTAGES WAS CONTINUED NEARLY TO THE CHURCH GATE; BUT ON THE OTHER SIDE, THERE WAS NOTHING TO OBSTRUCT THE VIEW OF GENTLY SWELLING MEADOW AND WOODED VALLEY AND THE DARK MASSES OF DISTANT HILLS. THAT RICH UNDULATING DISTRICT OF LOAMSHIRE TO WHICH HAYSLOPE BELONGED, LIES CLOSE TO A GRIM OUTSKIRT OF STONYSHIRE..."
