THE STORY OF "BILLY"

During the course of the play we spend a day with our hero, Billy Fisher, dreamer and wastrel, as he goes on a journey of self discovery. We see him at home, at work with a firm of Undertakers, and at leisure, in a local park, at a local football match and in the evening at a local dance.

Nagged by his family, pursued by his two(!) fiancées, threatened by his employer from who he has embezzled money, and entrapped by the dull surrounding of the industrial town in which he lives, Billy finds solace in the exercise of his fantastic and spontaneous imagination (where he is revolutionary, freedom fighter and star Hollywood scriptwriter), and dreams of escape to London.

Yet, Billy can only follow his nature: fabricating, making up stories. As a consequence, life in his hometown grows ever more difficult as the web of lies grows wider and more fragile.

When his only true friend, Liz, offers the opportunity of escape to London, script-writing capital of Europe, Billy finally has to choose between the uncertain challenge of this big city and the smalltime security of home, which scars his daily life.

Which will he choose?
