
Thank you for supporting YAT.

Jane Coles - Author

Cat With Green Violin was Jane Coles first stage play and was the second ever play produced at The Orange Tree Theatre, Richmond. Since then another of her plays – Low Flying Aircraft was staged there in 1999 and several of her other works have been performed at The Bush Theatre. Jane was born in Glasgow and brought up in Australia. She has worked for BBC TV as a director of arts documentaries and written extensively for radio. She has also been commissioned to write for the Royal Shakespeare Company.

Lynn Howes - Director

Lynn trained in acting at LAMDA, and has worked in theatre, film and TV. This is her first production with YAT since 2000 when she directed a studio piece based on the diaries of Maxim Gorky. Lynn joined YAT in 1988 for a production at the Hampton Court Theatre, and enjoyed acting in over thirty plays and musicals over the following ten years.

Louis Wain

Louis Wain was born in London in 1860, the son of a respected textile salesman and a French embroiderer of church fabrics. He was the oldest of six siblings and the only son, which put him under pressure to provide for them when his father died in 1880. Louis trained as an artist after a somewhat sporadic schooling and sickly childhood. Although he produced a great deal of work over many years, he usually opted to be paid one-off fees so that, in the long term he found himself relatively short of means. His had always been considered eccentric but by the early 1920's his condition had deteriorated and he was committed into hospital care in June 1923. A public appeal raised funds to move Louis to a nursing home where he remained until his death in 1939 by which time public tastes had moved on and he was largely unknown.

The play depicts events roughly between 1890 to 1930.
